

# CONDITIONALS

Types 0 / 1

If there is no  
school  
tomorrow...



Conditional clauses consist of 2 parts:

**IF CLAUSE** (hypothesis) and **MAIN CLAUSE** (result)

When we start the sentence with IF we use comma before the main clause

When we start with the main sentence, no comma is needed

## 0 TYPE CONDITIONAL

Used to express the **GENERAL TRUTH** or **THE SCIENTIFIC FACT**

**IF + PRESENT SIMPLE + PRESENT SIMPLE**

If you don't brush your teeth, you get  
cavities.

If we freeze water, it becomes ice.

0 conditional prevodimo sa AKO

If I \_\_\_\_\_ (wake up) late, I  
\_\_\_\_\_ (be) for work.

If you \_\_\_\_\_ (mix) flour and water,  
you \_\_\_\_\_ (get) glue.

# FIRST CONDITIONAL

**IF + PRESENT SIMPLE + WILL**

**REAL SITUATIONS, LIKELY TO HAPPEN IN  
THE PRESENT / FUTURE**

„If it rains, I won't go out”

**PROMISES / OFFERS** „If I finish my  
homework on time, I will help you with  
your project”

\*if + present simple + imperative = to give instructions

„If you want to attend the camp, fill in the form”


\*First conditional prevodimo sa AKO

If I \_\_\_\_\_ (have) enough money, I \_\_\_\_\_ (buy) some new shoes.

She \_\_\_\_\_ (miss) the bus if she \_\_\_\_\_ (not leave) soon.

If I \_\_\_\_\_ (see) her, I \_\_\_\_\_ (tell) her.

If I \_\_\_\_\_ (study) today, I \_\_\_\_\_ (go) to the party tonight.
